MEDIUM | 14.5 MILES



MERROSE FARM CYCLE ROUTE

The route starts from behind Pendower beach on the National Cycle Network Route 3 to Mevagissey, passing through Portloe, Treviskey, Caerhays, Porthluney and Gorran beach.

SURFACES

Grit-surfaced path. Can be muddy. Tarmac.

TRAFFIC

Mostly on quiet roads, short traffic free section behind Pendower beach.

OTHER ROUTES IN THE AREA

Continue from Mevagissey to St. Austell (signposted) via a mostly off road route along the river. National Cycle Network Route 3 west from Merrose Farm to Truro via King Harry Ferry.



SUITABILITY FOR YOUNG CHILDREN ✘

No - not for young children, but older children may be OK with supervision.

HILLS

Mostly fairly steep.

REFRESHMENTS/FACILITIES

Pubs at Veryan, Portloe, Mevagissey. Shops at Veryan, Portloe, Gorran Haven, Mevagissey. Beaches at Pendower, Portholland, Gorran Haven.

DIRECTIONS

- 1 Leave the site up the hill, and turn left onto the main road to join NCN 3, continue down hill and turn right to Pendower Beach. Continue on NCN 3 behind the beach, past the toilets and up the hill following NCN 3 signs to Veryan.
- 2 Turn right (NCN 3) signposted to Mevagissey past The New Inn and Elerkey house tea rooms and shop. Head straight on, signposted to the old fishing village of Portloe passing The Ship Inn and on to the quaint village of Treviskey.
- 3 At the T junction turn right (NCN 3). In a third of a mile turn right and continue to T junction keep following NCN 3. In 200yds turn right again signposted Caerhays – continue to T junction turning right signposted Caerhays for 1 mile passing St. Michael’s Church. Caerhays Castle and Gardens (camellias and rhododendrons) is on the left (open 14th Feb. to 5th June 10.00am – 5.00pm).
- 4 Continue to Porthluney Cove Beach, car park and garden entrance. There’s a café with seasonal food and drink and toilets here.
- 5 Continue to Gorran on NCN 3 turning right in the village (possible diversion to Gorran Haven Beach, toilets and shop 1 mile) on to Portmellon and Beach passing The Rising Sun Inn. At the junction turn right downhill into Mevagissey.
- 6 Return to Merrose Farm by the same route in reverse.
