Things to do

- 1 Bolton Abbey**
The romantic 12th Century ruins of a Priory beside the River Wharfe. Set in a 30,000 acre estate with walking trails and famous stepping stones.
- 2 Skipton Castle**
A remarkably well-preserved 900 year-old medieval fortress. Known for its complete roofed structure and for exploring the Banqueting Hall, Kitchen and Dungeon.
- 3 Embsay and Bolton Abbey Steam Railway**
A preserved heritage railway featuring scenic, steam-hauled journeys on magnificently restored tank engines, dating back to 1908.
- 4 Brontë Parsonage Museum**
The former home of the Brontë family, where Anne, Charlotte and Emily wrote their famous novels.
- 5 RHS Garden Harlow Carr**
A premier botanical garden designed for northern climates with the famous Betty's café on site.
- 6 Grassington**
A charming market town, famous as the filming location in All Creatures Great and Small. A scenic cobbled square, shops and a top history and walking destination.
- 7 Ilkley**
Set in Wharfedale and close to the Yorkshire Dales, whether you're shopping, enjoying an evening out or exploring the Yorkshire moors.
- 8 The Forbidden Corner**
A folly garden located in the Tuppill Park Estate, open to the public. The garden is designed as a maze, with tunnels, grottoes and sculptures.
- 9 Skipton Market Town**
The 'Gateway to the Yorkshire Dales,' famous for its 900 year-old Castle and scenic Leeds-Liverpool Canal, it offers a blend of history, bustling markets and natural beauty.
- 10 Parcevall Hall Gardens**
A renowned historic plantsmans garden at the heart of Wharfedale. Comprising of 24 acres of formal and woodland gardens.

Walk

The Yorkshire Dales National Park has outstanding scenery and a range of habitats for wildlife watching and adventure. Perfect for hiking.

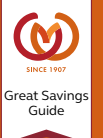
There are 72 miles of footpaths taking you through the Dales directly from site. There are also riverside walks to Burnsall and Bolton Abbey.

Cycle

The cycle route 2 miles from site is quite hilly and challenging.

Unfortunately cycling is not allowed on the estate footpaths.
