Things to do

1 The Royal Pavilion

A Grade I listed former royal seaside retreat for King George IV. Celebrated for its exotic design – the Indian-inspired Mughal domes and minarets, with Chinese-inspired interior.

2 Brighton Marina

The UK's largest marina, combining over 1,300 boat berths with a vibrant leisure complex, cinema, bowling, mini-golf, restaurants and shops.

3 Anne of Cleves House

A 15th Century timber-framed house granted by Henry VIII to his 4th wife as part of their annulment. Today, it operates as a museum showcasing Tudor life.

4 Sea Life Brighton

The world's oldest operating aquarium, featuring Victorian architecture, a 750,000 litre coral reef display and a glass-bottom boat experience.

5 Brighton Pier

A Victorian pleasure pier blending vintage British seaside nostalgia with a bustling amusement park, arcades and traditional eateries.

6 Brighton Zip

The longest zipwire on the South Coast, featuring dual 300-metre lines, launching from Madeira Drive, gliding alongside the Palace Pier with stunning, panoramic sea views.

7 Brighton i360

A 162 metre tall observation tower. Described as a vertical pier, the centre is a glass pod that glides up to offer 360-degree views of the coastline.

8 Lewes

Dotted with boutique shops and antique centres, this historic town has Lewes Castle, Anne of Cleves House and the Harvey's Brewery.

9 Hove

An elegant seaside resort known for its leafy grandeur. Featuring buttercream-coloured Regency architecture, pebble beaches and spacious avenues lined with shops.

10 Eastbourne

A vibrant seaside town famous as the sunniest place in the UK! Renowned for its 3 mile Victorian promenade, iconic pier and the dramatic chalk cliffs of Beachy Head.

Walk

Join the South Downs Way, a 100 mile route between Winchester and Eastbourne. Enjoy the views, wildlife and history.

Enjoy coastal walks from the site, heading west to Brighton and Shoreham.

Cycle

The nearest National Cycle Network route is 2, following the coast on a relatively flat path from Newhaven to Portsmouth.

For the more adventurous, off-road cycling on the South Downs is easily accessible. Nearby Devil's Dyke offers a challenge compensated by amazing views.
